

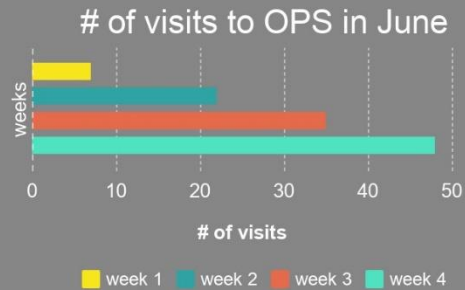
Overdose Prevention Site June 2018

The first overdose prevention site (OPS) in the city of Hamilton was opened in June 2018. **Hamilton Urban Core Community Health Centre** in partnership with the **Shelter Health Network** operates the site 7 days per week at 71 Rebecca Street. The OPS is funded by the **Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care** through the **Hamilton Niagara Haldimand Brant Local Health Integration Network (HNHB LHIN)**

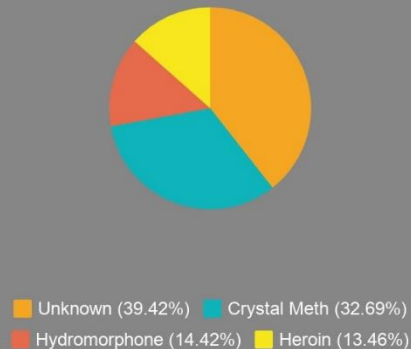
