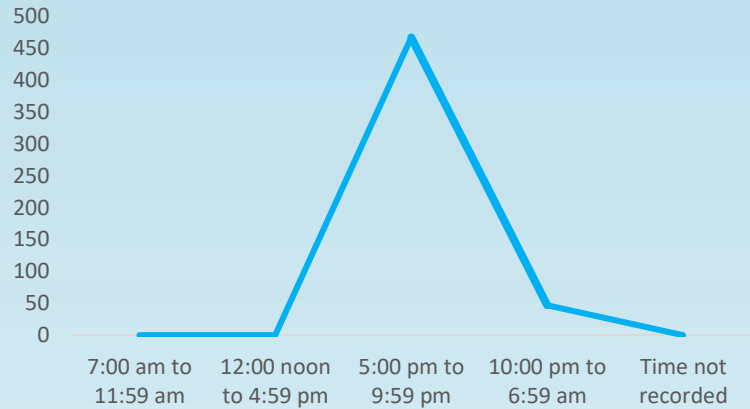
**Total # of Client Visits in February: 513**

The OPS is part of an overall harm reduction strategy— connecting people to the services they need, when and where they need them.

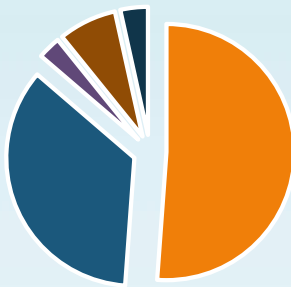


In February there was **78** visits by people under age **25**, and **435** visits by people between the ages of **25** and **64**.
