Notwithstanding the generality of the foregoing, Board members:

12. Will attend all board and committee meetings. The Board usually meets inperson 10 times per year approximately once per month, with occasional extra meetings either in-person or by teleconference call when necessary. The Board will make decisions by consensus whenever possible, with motions being voted on for any decision being documented in the meeting minutes.

In a case where a Board member cannot attend a meeting, the Board member notifies the Executive Director prior to the meeting with at least 24-hour notice if possible.
